Message from the Chairman

Brigadier (Ret'd) Mark Pountain CBE

Dear Members

I write having just attended the St Barbara's Day service and celebrations at Larkhill (St Barbara's Day 4th December), keenly aware that others have done similarly throughout the UK and more widely. As our Honorary Chaplain said, from the newest Gunner to the

Master Gunner St James's Park, from the youngest to oldest veteran, we all share a common and unique bond as members of the Gunner family.

That bond is reflected in the work of the RA Association to support comradeship and welfare, and I pay tribute and give thanks to all for their work this year – our new Regimental Secretary Colonel Paul Bates and the RAA team in Regimental Headquarters, the Controller and our charities' trustees, the Regimental Colonel and RASM, the RAA National Executive Committee, all our regional and local volunteers – serving and retired – and more widely all the other groupings who provide a network of support and fellowship, whether formally part of the RAA, affiliated or connected.

10 (Assaye) Battery

On the 12th of June, 34 (Seringapatam) Bty was formally redesignated as the first Bty of the Kings Gurkha Artillery (KGA), marking an extremely significant event in the history of both the Brigade of Gurkhas (BG) and the Royal Artillery (RA). The family's day was organised for the 21st of June to welcome Gurkha families and integrate UKTAP families into the KGA.

The day began with an impressive equipment display in 34 Battery's Gunpark, showcasing the unit's capabilities. The festivities then moved to the Garrison events area, where a multicultural food fair featured delicious offerings from Caribbean, Malawian, Fijian, British, and Nepali cuisines. Families enjoyed a variety of fun activities including an assault course, jungle lane, face painting, bouncy castle, and Fire Truck display. The event concluded with a lively raffle draw followed by live music and dance, bringing the community together in celebration and camaraderie.

106 (Yeomanry) Regiment Royal Artillery

457 (Hampshire Carabiners Yeomanry) Battery RA

457th (Hampshire Carabiners Yeomanry) Battery Royal Artillery is a diverse Army Reserve unit based at Blighmont Barracks, Southampton. As part of 106th (Yeomanry) Regiment Royal Artillery, it operates the High Velocity Missile Air Defence System and is the British Army's only Reserve Air Defence Regiment.

Over the past 12 months, the Battery has continued to demonstrate its operational relevance and commitment, deploying Reserve soldiers in support of 12th Regiment Royal Artillery on Operation SHADER in Northern Iraq. Additionally, the Battery has supported Project EALING (counter UAS trials) and WFX25 in California. The Battery remains committed in providing motivated and highly trained Reserve soldiers in support of its affiliated Regular Regiments operational taskings.

Given the inherently dispersed nature of the Army Reserves, with officers and soldiers residing across Hampshire, Wiltshire, Dorset, and Sussex, it's often a challenge to bring the entire Battery together outside of training commitments.

Thanks to the generous donation of £1,115.00 from the Royal Artillery Charitable Fund (RACF), the Battery was able to host an All-Ranks Summer Function on 05 July 2025 at Blighmont Barracks. 


Reporting a Death.....

Occasionally the office receives enquiries on how to report the death of an individual in receipt of an armed forces pension.

Guidance is available on [GOV.UK](#) on how to report the death of a member, whether the person was receiving a pension at the time of death or if they were a deferred member. The link below is informative and gives details of the information needed to report a death.

However, deaths can also be registered on 'Tell us Once' service, this is a government initiative in the UK (except NI) that allows you to notify multiple government agencies when a death is reported. The link below gives details of what is required:

This Service will notify relevant departments including: DVL, HM Passport Office, HMRC, local councils and the Armed Forces Pension Scheme. This service enables early notification of deaths, which means the processing of benefits are actioned quickly, to reduce the risk of potential overpayments that relatives may have to address in their time of grief.

REJOINERS: YOUR NATION NEEDS YOU

THERE ARE TWO ROUTES AVAILABLE TO REJOINERS:

Fast Track Pathway. Is A Veteran Who:

- Left the Regular Army within the last 36 months.
- Is returning to the same Main Trade and cap/badge.
- Had no less than 24 months remaining engagement or commission.
- On leaving had a medical grade of Medically Fully Deployable or Limited Deployable and can self-declare they have had no significant injury or illness.
- Have no unspent convictions.

Regular Rejoiner Pathway. This is for veterans who left the Regular Army but who are not eligible for the Fast Track. Your pathway is approximately 8 weeks, but can vary based on medicals, security vetting and interviews.

Fast Track Pathway - 4 weeks


Regular Rejoiner Pathway - Approximately 8 weeks

Age limit. The upper age limit for all rejoiners is 57.
